WHY A NEW HOME?

Klinic has reached maximum capacity in our current location; because of this, we experience challenges in providing efficient and effective services. The new site will offer increased mental health wellness groups, primary care, drop-in counselling and other group services to address community demand. The new location is centrally located in the West Broadway area, which is experiencing issues with youth homelessness and addiction, areas where Klinic can provide increased support and expertise. Currently we are often unable to take on new clients or offer new services due to space constraints. Our current (and future site) are often utilized by community partners and groups. A significant amount of our clients live with multiple disabilities and we are committed to increasing physical accessibility to our space.

Sexuality Education Resource Centre Manitoba MB (SERC) is a community-based, non-profit, pro-choice organization dedicated to promoting sexual health through education. SERC employs approximately 30 staff in offices located in Winnipeg and Brandon, providing education and supports around healthy sexuality, with a focus on young people, the school system and newcomer communities.

Manitoba Federation of Labour (MFL) Occupational Health Centre

The MFL Occupational Health Centre is a non-profit community health centre that focuses on risks and injuries to workers. MFL provides injury assessment and health and safety training to workplaces and joint health and safety committees, aiming to make workplaces safer for workers through prevention and healing.

Klinic, SERC and MFL's services promote social inclusion. Accessible health and support services are key parts of supporting labour market participation.

OPPORTUNITY

Klinic's new home at 167 Sherbrook will allow us to consolidate our services and co-locate with our partners SERC and MFL. Our objective is to renovate the new site, ensuring an inclusive and accessible place within our community. Upon completion, we will be able to support expanded services in all three organizations, including:

- Health and medical services for marginalized populations, particularly those living with disabilities, mental illness and/or addictions
- Drop-in, short term, and longer term counselling for marginalized populations, particularly those living with disabilities, mental illness and/or addictions
- Training and education for service providers on supporting people who are experiencing trauma and loss
- Wellness and mental health groups for people in our community of all abilities
- Inclusion-based sexual health education for educators, parents, newcomers, Indigenous communities and youth
