

# **Board Recruitment Backgrounder 2019**

Klinic Community Health provides a full range of health related services from medical care to counselling to education. Klinic promotes health and quality of life for all and helps people make choices about their own health. Klinic also addresses the special needs of our neighborhoods and help communities organize on issues of concern.

Klinic Inc., operating as Klinic Community Health (Klinic), is a charitable, not for profit, community-based primary health care centre providing services out of six sites across the province. Klinic's head office is located in the core area of Winnipeg at 870 Portage Avenue. Services at this site are staffed twenty-four hours a day, three hundred and sixty-five days per year. Services are also provided out of the Manitoba Farm, Rural and Northern Support Services located in the City of Brandon, Tec Voc High School, TERF – New Directions for Children and Youth, Klinic on Campus at the University of Winnipeg, and Sage House/Mount Carmel Clinic. Klinic provides on-going information technology support to five community agencies. Throughout the past year, Klinic offered training, professional development and education services at many locations beyond our permanent locations mentioned above. We have provided services in every Regional Health Authority across the Province of Manitoba.

In 2017 Klinic purchased a new main site at 167 Sherbrook Street and has just completed the design phase, with renovations anticipated to start this spring and take about one year to complete.

## Klinic operates under the following strategic framework:

#### Governance

Klinic is governed by a community Board of Directors consisting of up to fifteen (15) members.

Any Manitoba resident who subscribes to the Vision, Mission and Values of Klinic may be nominated to the Board.

Directors are elected for a two-year term, beginning at the Annual General Meeting. The bylaws include a 4 term maximum which was enacted in 2012. The Board of Directors includes representatives of the immediate and broader community. The Klinic Board of Directors has members from social services, business and academia as well as individuals who support the work of Klinic. It is a governance focused board with an emphasis on creation and oversight of Klinic's strategic directions, which are implemented and operationalized by the Executive Director, with support of the senior management team.

The Klinic Board meets a minimum of 5 times each year between September and June. Meetings are typically held Wednesdays at Klinic, 870 Portage Avenue from 5:30 until 8:00 in the evening. Supper is provided. As well as attending the monthly meetings, Board members are expected to participate in at least one committee.

### **Operations**

Klinic has a current operating budget of approximately ten million dollars which has increased steadily over the past five years. Klinic receives core operating funding from the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority (WRHA), and program specific funding from the Province of Manitoba, along with a variety of other funders and private foundations.

Klinic provides primary health care services to Manitobans in three overarching program areas – Community Health and Education, Counselling Services and Health Services with a complement of almost 200 staff and an additional volunteer workforce of about the same.



## Klinic Services

Services are divided between 3 programs areas; Health Services, Counselling Services, and Community Health and Education. These services are provided by phone, in person, and at a community level.
