PRIMARY CARE


- 336 new health services clients


STI KLINIC

STRENGTHENING ORGANIZATIONAL CAPACITY KLINIC'S GOAL BASED ON THE STRATEGIC PLAN: TO GROW KLINIC AS A LEADER IN BEST PRACTICE, VALUES DRIVEN, CLIENT AND COMMUNITY CARE

- Hired 22 staff for newly created and existing positions across the agency
- Received funding for **3** new programs: Mobile Withdrawal Management Service, The Manitoba Mino Pimatisiwin Model of Sexually Transmitted Blood Borne Infections (STBBI) Care (pilot site), and Provincial STBBI supplemental funding
- 5 staff/volunteer/board committees met regularly to support different elements of the 2017-2022 Klinic Strategic Operational Plan
- 3 staff/volunteer/board committees met reguarly to help implement the recommendations of Klinic's position papers

COMMUNITY HEALTH AND EDUCATION



- Public Education, Evolve & Manitoba Trauma Information and Education Centre delivered 56 sessions to 967 Service Providers
- 234 Life in Balance sessions for 1,489 participants

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

3 community outreach testing clinics offered dry blood spot testing for STBBIs to over 30 clients

- 5 new groups were offered, with over 116 participating clients
- 40% increase of traffic on klinic.mb.ca with 98,726 users, of which 85,070 were new
- 27 news articles and interviews with various media, local and national
- 14% increase in Twitter followers (@KlinicCHC)
