Klinic is a non-profit, community-based health care centre in part of the core area of Winnipeg. We provide primary health care to our geographic community as well as provide specialized health services to the Province of Manitoba. Klinic promotes health and quality of life for all; helps people make choices about their own health in a context which is culturally sensitive and supportive of personal and community development; seeks to address the special needs of our neighbourhoods and helps communities organize on issues of concern; and looks to our community for direction.

What are the Services provided by Klinic?

- **24-Hour Telephone Services for Manitobans:**
 - Manitoba Suicide Line
 - Crisis Counselling Line
 - Sexual Assault Crisis Line
 - Seniors Abuse Support Line
- **Community Health & Education Services**
 - community health education and community development.
 - volunteer recruitment, screening and training
 - medical, legal support and advocacy for sexual assault victims
 - youth health education services through Teen Talk
 - training and education in areas such as crisis intervention, suicide prevention, sexual assault and family violence
- **Counselling Services**
 - post trauma counselling for individual and families who have experienced sexual assault, childhood abuse, suicide bereavement, people affected by family violence, and support for people leaving the sex trade and recovering from childhood sexual abuse and addictions
 - no fee drop-in counselling to anyone for any reason
 - telephone support, counselling and information to those whose life is affected by farming, agriculture and rural living provided by the Manitoba Farm & Rural Stress Line (provided in Brandon; staffed by local residents)
 - Workers Compensation Distress Line providing 24-hour confidential telephone counselling for those having trouble dealing with the effects of their injury
- **Health Services**
 - Primary health care including prevention, health promotion and education provided by a multi-disciplinary team including doctors, nurse practitioners, primary health care nurses, medical assistants, dieticians, social workers and lab technologists
 - Service areas include family practice, reproductive/sexual health care (including youth), child and maternal health, geriatrics, HIV, Hep C and TB
 - Outreach services for the elderly and those with mobility and mental health issues provided by physicians, nurses, social workers and dieticians

KLINIC PROGRAMS

Klinic Community Health Centre provided services throughout Manitoba during the 2010/11 fiscal year. These services were offered by 207 employees providing a full time equivalent of 99 individuals and 322 volunteers providing 37,859 hours of service, a full time equivalent of 18.2 individuals.

SERVICE HIGHLIGHTS

The Critical Incident Reporting and Support Line (CIRSL) began operations at Klinic two years ago and was the first of its kind in North America. The CIRSL not only provides, takes receives and reports information related to critical incidents that occur within a health care facility, it also provides emotional support to those affected by a critical incident.

As part of a plan to enhance access to phone line counselling services for Older Adults, Klinic is partnering with Age and Opportunity and the Seniors Directorate to operate a 24/7 Older Adults Abuse Support Line.

Klinic completed its second year of delivering trauma-informed counselling to service providers across Manitoba. The response was overwhelming and this training is now receiving the attention of regions outside our province. Two trainings were delivered in Nunavit and one has been scheduled this fall in Vancouver.

Klinic launched a new web site: www.de-stress.ca. This website offers simple and yet powerful techniques for managing stress and promoting calmness and wellbeing as well as helps people recognize stress and understand the profound affect it has on health.

Teen Talk launched its new website at the end of January. The website includes the following: information and resources in the areas of sexual and reproductive health (including a section on FASD), substance use awareness, mental health, and body image. The entire Peer Support Training Manual and our Tool Kit for Service Providers are available for free download on the site, as well as all of our handouts and resource sheets. The website also features an interactive Youth Corner section showcasing the art and stories of our Peer Supporter Youth Volunteers. You may visit the site at www.teentalk.ca.

Klinic, along with St. Matthew's-Maryland Community Ministry, Klinic participated in the research project: Exploring Collaboration and Building Community Organization Capacity for Population Health Promotion in an Inner-City Neighbourhood. The study helped to identify how collaboration benefits our two organizations and the communities we serve.

Klinik's Sexual Assault Crisis Program staff along with staff from Osborne House and Sage House, were profiled in the CUPE RESPECT Campaign video "***So Much With So Little: Who cares for the caregivers?***" The video outlined the challenges staff face in their work and their efforts to raise understanding and awareness of the impact of violence against women.

The Community Organizations Network and Knowledge Exchange (CONNEX) Forum was held in Winnipeg in February. The event brought together past and current Health Canada Drug Strategy funded projects, youth and collateral service providers to network, share resources and finalize the structure of the knowledge exchange network. This project is focussed on substance use prevention amongst youth.

The Volunteer Training Advisory Committee undertook a review of the volunteer training materials. The review included the evaluation tools that were being used to screen and evaluate volunteers, and to get feedback from volunteers on the training. An Evaluation Subcommittee was formed to consider options for evaluation forms that would fit with the goals of the training, the needs of each program (Crisis, Sexual Assault Program, and Manitoba Farm and Support Services), and recommendations from our American Association of Suicidology Accreditation. New forms were created and approved by the larger committee. These evaluations will be pilot tested for a year (began January 2011).

We were thrilled to participate in the development of the much needed Bridge Care Clinic, which serves the unique needs of the refugee population. Bridge Care opened in November, 2010. They are now seeing all Government Assisted Refugees (GARs) when they first arrive in Winnipeg. They will be seen there for initial assessment, health screening and management of immediate health needs. After about 6-12 months they will be transitioned to family physicians and nurse practitioners in the community. Klinik is accepting client referrals from Bridge Care. We continue to provide refugee health services to non GARs and other refugee clients who do not meet the criteria for assessment at Bridge Care.

Our TransGender Klinik has been operating for one year now. We are seeing clients for medical management of Trans health, and to provide referrals for surgical management. We provide primary care to clients who do not have a primary care physician or nurse practitioner. The clinic has grown rapidly and we continue to gauge the need in this community. Clearly we have not met the need yet, as there are people waiting to be seen.

INNOVATION

The Manitoba Farm and Rural Support Line was re-launched as Manitoba Farm and Rural Support Services. Part of this re-launch includes the introduction of on-line counselling and support (Chat and Skype).

Dr. Mike Dillon and Lisa Begg R.D. are working with CBC on their "Live Right Now" series. They are helping one family in their quest to improve their overall health and lead healthier lifestyles. Individual members of the family have quit smoking, increased activity, managed reproductive health concerns, and begun dealing with medical concerns such as hypertension and sleep disturbance. Dr. Dillon has been able to collaborate effectively with the family's usual family physician. The goal, of course, is not just improved health for one family, but education to a larger community, through CBC's radio and television pieces, as well as website and social media (Facebook).

Klinik partnered with the Canadian Centre for Policy Alternatives (CCPA) on a research project called "What Has Happened to the Rental Stock and Where Have All the People Gone?" The research is focused on the ongoing housing crisis in Winnipeg, especially in the Spence, West Broadway and Daniel Mac/St. Matthews neighbourhoods. Winnipeg is losing low-cost rental units as rents are increased at above-guideline rates (sometimes increasing by as much as 15%) and as more and more apartments are being converted to condos. This has caused many people to be displaced from their homes as they can no longer afford to pay their rent or to purchase their apartment when it becomes a condo. Since this issue affects many Klinik clients, the CCPA partnered with the Program Evaluation and Research Analyst to recruit Klinik clients for interviews. Several Klinik clients participated in the research and the data is currently being compiled. The results of the research will be included in the CCPA's annual State of the Inner City Report in the Winter of 2011.

One of our physicians has finished training and received their methadone prescribers license, and two others have begun the process. One nurse has also attended for training. As such, we have begun seeing clients who have been stabilized on methadone at the MINE Clinic, for ongoing management and primary care. As the number of people seeking treatment for addiction increases, the ability to provide ongoing care in the community has become more necessary. We are pleased we have been able to work collaboratively with the MINE Clinic to increase our ability to respond to this need.

RECOGNITION

Klinik holds an annual agency recognition award event to acknowledge and celebrate with staff and volunteers. In conjunction with the Annual General Meeting in 2010, Klinik recognized one person for 30 years of service, two for 25 years of service, four for 20 years of service, two for 15 years of service, four for 10 years of service and eighteen for 5 years of service.

It is Klinik's staff and volunteers that make Klinik the successful community health centre it is.
